As community colleges continue to diversify and increase in importance, the significance of addressing human rights, war and peace, conflict resolution, social justice, and international relations in these settings will increase. If you are interested in these areas as a faculty member, administrator or graduate student attending this distinctive seminar can provide you with a better understanding of contemporary issues and the tools to engage learners.

The National Community College Peacebuilding Seminar is the only Washington, DC based seminar dealing with global conflict issues. Since the first seminar in 2013, over 125 professionals have attended.

The seminar is designed for a cohort of 20-30. Those attending represent a multidisciplinary array of fields and backgrounds. They will be learning from Washington, DC insiders and experts on global issues and peacebuilding including from the U.S. government, nongovernmental organizations, international organizations, academics, and practitioners. Themes often covered include international affairs, refugees, human rights, social justice, media, dialogue, program and curriculum development, conflict resolution, culture, and experiential learning. During the seminar, one field day is planned to visit local institutions and organizations. The schedule allows for personal time for visiting Washington, DC.

The seminar is open to all those interested or working with community college populations including full and part-time faculty, administrators, and graduate students. Internationals can also attend. As part of the registration fee, each participant will receive a copy of *Peacebuilding in Community Colleges: A Teaching Resource* (USIP Press 2013) or *Peace Jobs: A Student's Guide to Starting a Career Working for Peace* (Information Age Publishing 2016).
